City of Belleview Urges Residents to Prepare for Hurricane Season

BELLEVIEW, FL – As hurricane season begins, the City of Belleview reminds all residents of the importance of being prepared for potential storms. Now is the time to take action to safeguard your family, home, and community. The City encourages residents to stay informed and take the necessary steps to stay safe during hurricane season, which runs from June 1 through November 30.

The website will be regularly updated with the latest storm information to keep residents informed throughout the season. The City encourages residents to also follow their social media accounts on Facebook/Instagram (@cityofbelleview) for updates.

In addition, the City of Belleview urges all residents to register for **Alert Marion**, an emergency notification system that sends critical alerts directly to your phone or email. Registration for the service can be completed online at [Alert Marion](#).

Tips for Staying Safe During Hurricane Season:

1. **Create an Emergency Kit:** Include non-perishable food, water, medications, flashlights, batteries, and a first aid kit.
2. **Secure Your Home:** Check windows and doors, trim trees and shrubs, and reinforce your roof and garage doors.
3. **Know Your Evacuation Routes:** Familiarize yourself with local evacuation routes and shelters. Ensure your vehicle is fueled and ready to go.
4. **Stay Informed:** Monitor the latest storm updates from local authorities and the National Weather Service.
5. **Communicate with Family:** Make sure all family members know your evacuation plan and how to contact each other in case of an emergency.

Chief Holland of the Belleview Police Department stresses the importance of staying vigilant and being prepared, stating:

"Hurricane season is a time for our community to come together and prioritize safety. By staying informed, having an emergency plan in place, and registering for Alert Marion, we can ensure that Belleview is ready for any storm. The safety of our residents is our top priority, and we are here to support you every step of the way."
